The Broomfield County Democratic Party honors and defends the human rights of every person in the United States, regardless of religion, ethnicity, gender, sexual preference, country of origin, citizenship status, wealth or lack of wealth, etc and as per our US Constitution and Bill of Rights. These rights include healthcare, education, proper nutrition, family unity, protection under the law including labor laws, protection from exploitation and entrapment, and the right to the pursuit of happiness, due process and right to a fair hearing, right to counsel, right of appeal, and right to humane treatment.

A. PRESERVING RIGHTS AND LIBERTIES

CIVIL RIGHTS

No one shall be treated differently because of race, religion, gender, identity, age, ethnicity, disability or membership in an organization. We support marriage equality without regard for gender or sexual orientation. All laws passed should reflect this standard.

We also believe:

- The government has no legitimate authority to intrude into the private lives of individuals when there is no evidence of threat to the security of others;
- Personal liberty should be limited only after a careful and objective consideration of risks to the greater community without regard to socioeconomic status, race, religion, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, gender/sexual identity, age, or class and that no criminal action can be brought against a citizen without proper justification;
- That all constitutional rights should be restored upon parole and release;
- That the death penalty in the US should be abolished;
- That indefinite detention by the military of alleged terror suspects without charge, trial, or representation by counsel should be abolished.

Therefore we will:

- a) Support the increase in protections against unreasonable search and seizure, including acquisition of DNA, gathering of cyber material, and use of existing technologies or those developed in the future;
- b) Call for an end to warrantless wiretapping and physical searches of persons or property of US citizens;
- c) Call for an end for immunity for telecommunications companies that facilitate governmental spying and recordkeeping on US citizens;

- d) Support legislation that requires written consent of the individual involved before sharing their health and medical information with other entities;
- e) Support stricter definitions of “blight” when used for purposes of eminent domain and/or condemnation of property in the City/County of Broomfield.

HOUSING OF REFUGEES

We believe that Colorado and Broomfield should support an individual's right to house refugees in their own home without penalty.

We also believe:

- That the necessity to house refugees in private homes is, in part, a result of a dysfunctional immigration system;
- That legal admission of persons into the US who have no history of serious criminal activity should be allowed for family reunification, flight from persecution, response to humanitarian crises, economic need, business and employment needs in the US, and educational programs and opportunities.
- That the country of origin of these individuals should not be a factor in our consideration for admittance to the US.

Therefore we will:

- a) Oppose legislation that criminalizes human acts of assistance to undocumented immigrants;
- b) Call on our elected officials to develop immigration laws that provide an efficient, expeditious system for legal entry of immigrants into the US;
- c) Call on our elected officials to develop a path to citizenship and/or provisions for unauthorized immigrants already living in the US to earn legal status;
- d) Support increases in federal funding for English language and civic education classes for all immigrants and to work with others to provide these educational opportunities locally;
- e) Call of federal officials to desist in adding to creation of a wall between our country and our neighbors;
- f) Oppose the classification of “illegal immigrant” as a criminal offense;
- g) Establish a moratorium on deportations of immigrant community members until enactment of immigration reform, with the exception of immigrants convicted of violent crimes;
- h) Call for our local, state, and federal entities to ensure easy and affordable registration, opportunity to work, and allow equal access to services provided by law, including the right to obtain an immigrant driver’s license.
- i) Encourage undocumented immigrants to report crimes by repealing the Clear Law Enforcement for Alien Removal (CLEAR) ACT;
- j) Call on our elected officials to allow the use of U-visas to give victims of certain crimes temporary work eligibility;
- k) Call on our elected officials to provide streamlined paths to citizenship for undocumented workers who provide information on illegal behavior by their employers if said workers have not committed crimes themselves.

SAFEGUARDS AGAINST ABUSE OF POWER

STATE AUTHORITY

Federal law should permit states to enact their own laws regulating the use of marijuana.

TRANSPARENCY IN GOVERNMENT

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

All criminal laws and statutes should focus on prevention as well as enforcement.

We also believe:

- Humane treatment is required for all people, even those who have been detained by our legal system;
- Incarcerated persons should be safe, should receive reasonable care and should have full access to rehabilitation services without regard to ability to pay;
- The victims of crimes deserve support and should be kept apprised of the status of offenders who have done them harm;
- Local law enforcement entities should not be militarized, including the use of drones and/or tanks;
- Arrest and sentencing procedures must be fair and just, and must respect the rights of all citizens;
- Miranda warnings should always be given to a person who is being detained at the first interview by law enforcement except in situations where human safety would be compromised;
- All accused individuals should have access to quality defense counsel at the onset of a criminal investigation;
- Due process should be observed for all people detained, including those under suspicion of terrorism;
- Any detainee should be released in a timely manner when there is insufficient evidence to hold them;

- The practice of over-charging alleged offenders as a motivating tool for plea-bargaining should be ended;
- Mandatory sentencing and three-strikes rules for sentencing should be eliminated;
- That before a juvenile case is filed in adult court it should require judicial review and opportunity for defense and appeal;
- Ongoing education should be provided for all criminal justice system professionals to help them effectively identify and deal appropriately with mental health issues, sexual victimization, trauma, domestic violence, child abuse/neglect, disability and other factors that might affect individual behaviors.
- That there should be strong penalties for gun tracking and other gun-related offenses.
- The use of solitary confinement and extreme sensory deprivation should be significantly reduced;
- The influence of money should be taken out of the criminal justice system by eliminating all for-profit detention facilities and programs, both during and after incarceration;

Therefore we will:

- a) Call for law enforcement to ensure that there is a comprehensive and seamless support system for victims of crimes;
- b) Call for a tort system that allows the full recovery by insured parties of damages and does not victimize the family of an offender by taking everything they have;
- c) Call for the establishment of non-institutional responses for those who require help but not incarceration, such as the mentally ill and/or substance users;
- d) Support legislation and regulation that ends the practice of lifetime stigma without appeal or reasonable expectation of rehabilitation for non-criminal sexual misbehavior where there is no reasonable expectation of harm to the community;
- e) Call for necessary medical care be provided for all prisoners for both physical and mental health;
- f) Call for an amendment to current laws regarding juveniles sentenced to life in prison to be eligible for parole after 15 years instead of the current 40 years;

PUBLIC SAFETY

Each individual has a right of access to food, water, air, and safe living conditions.

We also believe:

- That our laws should fully protect and promote equality, safety, and respect for all aspects of life so that all people can live without fear, abuse, or retaliation;
- That the forced servitude and/or human trafficking of any person into situations such as, but not limited to, forced marriages, illegal adoptions, sweatshops, and unpaid domestic servitude, must be ended;
- Our country, state, and community should minimize the use of synthetic chemicals, hormones, and antibiotics in agriculture;
- That the infrastructure in our community, state, and nation must be repaired and improved;

Therefore we will:

- a) Support leadership in their commitment to policies and incentives that significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions;
- b) Promote policies to reinvigorate the American economy and rebuild our country's critical infrastructure including local water and utility systems, the national power grid system, schools, bridges, roads, highway and mass transportation infrastructure, etc;
- c) Support the creation of a Department of Peace that will focus energy and resources toward working with countries on a global level to establish peace.

HEALTHCARE

Every resident in the United States should have access to affordable, quality healthcare.

We also believe:

- In the establishment of a universal, single-payer health system that guarantees comprehensive health care for all;
- We should support the Affordable Care Act and the Colorado Health Exchange up until universal healthcare becomes a reality;
- Our government should support efforts to provide for the long-term solvency and adequate funding of Medicare, Medicaid, and Social Security Disability Insurance;
- State legislation should promote price transparency by requiring all healthcare providers, hospitals and insurance companies to provide disclosure of pricing for different procedures;
- A universal healthcare system should be determined by local needs with health care premium money to remain in Colorado and to be governed democratically by Colorado residents with the interests of the members rather than outside interests;
- In supporting more robust funding for public health services including public health promotion, disease prevention programs, and advancement of public health science;
- Our government should ensure that quality healthcare will always be affordable and accessible for all US residents;
- Fraud should be reduced by eliminating duplication and unnecessary care and lowering the costs of administration, pharmaceutical products and medical supplies while supporting local innovative efforts to provide high quality, cost effective health care to all;
- Funding to Medicare and Medicaid healthcare providers to promote their participation in these programs;
- Healthcare payers should be allowed to negotiate prescription drug costs directly with the pharmaceutical industry including sources outside the US;
- Medicare should not be privatized;
- Incentives should be put in place for medical practitioners to encourage services in underserved areas;
- Gender, racial and ethnic disparities in health care delivery should be eliminated

- The full range of women’s reproductive care should be covered;
- Medical decisions should be voluntary and kept between patients and their healthcare providers and not be subject to government, insurance, or third party involvement;
- That support for medical training should be increased and should also include support for training in complementary and alternative medicine;
- That firearm safety is a health issue;
- That TABOR is damaging our ability to provide quality and affordable healthcare and should be repealed or amended;

Therefore we will:

- a) Support legislation for a national, universal healthcare system that guarantees quality, affordable, and comprehensive healthcare for all through a not-for—profit single-payer financed system;
- b) Support the development and increased availability of home and community healthcare delivery in Broomfield City/County;
- c) Support public policies that are based on scientifically sound research;
- d) Support the removal of federal roadblocks for the funding of research on the medical uses of marijuana;
- e) Support state legislation to promote price transparency by requiring all healthcare providers, hospitals and insurance companies to provide disclosure of pricing for different procedures
- f) Support access to free mental health services for those in need
- g) Support women’s reproductive freedom and body integrity
- h) Support reasonable restrictions on gun ownership including extensive background checks and waiting periods for the sale of firearms;
- i) Support the banning of anti-biotic use in livestock as a means to control the evolution and the spread of superbugs.

RIGHT TO DIE

Colorado should allow cognizant individuals the right to determine to end their own life when they have a terminal condition and/or are in a terminal state of being.

We also believe:

- That the right to die is substantively different than assisted suicide;
- That individuals should not be forced into enduring extreme pain and/or undergoing invasive and/or physically harmful treatments when the prognosis for extending their life is minimal.

Therefore we will:

- a) Support legalization and funding for death with dignity;
- b) Support the training of emergency medical and hospital personnel in understanding and subsequently abiding by advance directives and DNR orders.

DECLARING WAR

Congress shall retain the sole right to declare war and that the motives for war must be transparent and that war must only be used as the last resort.

We also believe:

- That our foreign policy should reflect our highest principles of freedom, justice for all, equality, human dignity, the right of all people for self determination, the rule of international law, and the principles stated in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights;
- In engaging with the people of the world as partners and contributing to the peace and security of the world;
- That our nation can work together positively with others to assist in the resolution of conflict without imposing its will;
- That conflicts are best resolved by agreements between the parties involved.

Therefore we will:

- a) Call upon Congress and the President to partner within the community of nations to achieve peaceful resolution to conflict, protect human rights, enact economically justified policies, and address the global threat of international terrorism through education, reduction of poverty, and eradication of extremism;
- b) Call upon Congress to vigorously ensure that nonviolent conflict resolution and diplomatic solutions should be exhausted before they declare war;
- c) Call upon our elected officials to support adherence to the Anti-Landmine, Anti-Cluster Bomb, and Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaties and to maintain strict adherence to international agreements including the Geneva Conventions, the Nuremburg Principles, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and the International War Crimes Tribunal;
- d) Call on our elected officials to prohibit the use of torture or “enhanced interrogation techniques” under all circumstances and in compliance with international law and to take legal measures against any government entities, contractors, or individuals who persist in using these methods;
- e) Support entities that are working to ensure that veterans and their families in our community, our state, and our nation have easy and sufficient access to earned benefits, including but not limited to healthcare, education, and jobs.

C. GUARANTEEING AN EDUCATED POPULACE AND A VIBRANT ECONOMY

Including the following:

- Education

EDUCATION

Every resident in the United States should have access to affordable, quality education. We must increase state K-12 funding to prerecession levels and improve funding for higher education.

We also believe:

- The civic and economic vitality of our community, the State of Colorado, our nation and the world depend on the skill level, creative problem-solving capacity, and leadership ability of our populace;
- High quality public education for all learners regardless of learning ability or style, must be accessible and affordable from preschool through postsecondary programs including vocational education;
- Local, state, and federal governments share responsibility for meeting the needs of all children and must be transparent and accountable for the actions they take on behalf of our schools;
- Adequate funding for all areas of education is a necessity and a much more effective funding mechanism for public schools must be implemented;
- Locally elected school boards should be supported with the funding they need to provide a quality pre-K through 12 education, including the funding of any state and/or federal mandates;
- Every student should have access to a high quality neighborhood school;
- Education funding must be allocated equitably across the state and must be sufficient to address the needs of at-risk, special needs, and English language learners and this funding must also provide for smaller class sizes;
- The availability of quality early childhood education programs, especially for those from disadvantaged backgrounds, is essential to break the cycle of poverty and to provide academic and economic opportunity for this and future generations;
- A well-rounded, balanced and fair assessment system, not dependent on standardized test scores, is essential for accurate evaluation of student achievement and teacher effectiveness;
- Vouchers that can be applied toward tuition at a private or religious school rather than to the public school to which the student is assigned undermine the public education system;
- The highest quality of education is dependent on the quality of teachers, professors, and other individuals employed in the public education system and they should have salaries at least comparable to professionals in other industries with similar training, years of experience, and levels of responsibility;
- The right to associate is fundamental to our democracy and that all public education employees should have a right to participate in a union if they desire;
- All Colorado students, pre-K through post secondary, deserve a safe and healthy environment in their school buildings and grounds, including the absence of any concealed firearms in the possession of all people present other than members of the police or hired security guards;
- Decisions affecting public education should be made at the appropriate level of local government – school boards for the most issues and that private corporate

interests or religious groups should not have undue influence on decisions regarding curricula, educational resources, and standardized assessments.

Therefore we will:

- a) Call upon party leaders and elected officials to call for Constitutional amendment ballot measures to repeal language that impacts adequate funding of education, including TABOR, and the Gallagher Amendment;
- b) Call for increased K-12 funding that will allow school districts to rebuild and restore programs and refill teaching positions that were eliminated;
- c) Support policies and programs that honor all students including students from diverse populations and those with special needs;
- d) Support school district policies that support hiring teachers, para-professionals, staff and administrators of diverse backgrounds to reflect the student populations;
- e) Support an increase in the availability of dual-immersion (two-way bilingual) programs;
- f) Support increased professional development for all school district employees;
- g) Support the implementation of a curriculum that meets the needs of diverse learning styles with multiple measurements of achievement and multiple pathways to success;
- h) Support a curriculum that prepares students with skills of critical thinking, problem solving, creativity, innovation, and collaboration and that recognizes the equal importance of all subjects including the arts, music, physical education, healthy living, foreign language, civics, history, and fact-based science;
- i) Support the DREAM Act in order to give the children of undocumented adults a path to legal residency and citizenship;
- j) Support an increase in financial aid, merit scholarships and needs-based grants for Colorado students;
- k) Support adequate salaries and benefits for adjunct professors and part-time instructors;
- l) Support the provision of good working conditions, adequate compensation, fair evaluation, due process, and academic freedom for teaching professionals;
- m) Support funding for capital construction and renovation that provide a safe, supportive, and healthy teaching and learning environment.

ECONOMY AND WORKER RIGHTS

Each adult worker should have access to a living wage and have the right to collectively bargain for the terms of employment.

We also believe:

- In a \$15 minimum wage as a starting point;
- That the minimum wage needs to increase with inflation;
- That unions lead to better working conditions and wages;

Therefore we will:

- a) Encourage employers and legislators to institute paid family leave that includes both maternity and paternity leave;

- b) Encourage lawmakers to pass legislation that will eliminate the abuse of independent contractors;
- c) Encourage our city/county government to pay all employees and the employees of contractors a living wage.

INTERNET NEUTRALITY

The Internet should be accessible to all citizens and treated as a public utility.

We also believe:

- That internet access is an essential resource for many aspects of modern day life;
- That the internet has allowed for many advances in communication;
- That internet service providers (ISPs) must deliver content with neutrality and without favoring or blocking any particular sources;
- That ISPs should not offer “fast lanes” to any source for any reason, as this compromises the neutrality of the internet;
- That Internet access provides economic and educational advantages.

Therefore we will:

- a) Recognize the United Nations Human Rights Council’s resolution that internet access is a basic human right;
- b) Fight any attempts from ISPs that may compromise the neutrality of the internet;
- c) Support a city/county broadband service, which has been shown to bring increased speeds and reduced costs for Internet service.

D. MAINTAINING THE INTEGRITY OF POLITICAL PROCESSES

FAIR ELECTIONS AND VOTERS’ RIGHTS

The right of all citizens to vote must be protected.

We also believe:

- Voters must be factually informed on the issues;
- Citizens must know that their vote is counted honestly and fairly;
- Gerrymandering of Congressional Districts must be prohibited;
- Political bribery must be stopped, making it illegal for politicians to accept money or favors from the special interests they regulate;
- Voter suppression must be stopped.

- Ballot accountability in the form of paper receipts for all votes including those from voting machines;
- Full access to election processes should be afforded to homeless persons without a street address;

Therefore we will:

- a) Call for our leaders to ensure the right to vote without undue hardship being imposed on the voter to prove who he/she is;
- b) Call for our leaders to enact protections for voters who might have been (or who might be) disenfranchised because of the Supreme Court gutting of the Voting Rights Act, purging of voter roles, broken voter machines, etc;
- c) Encourage our state elected officials to study the implications of allowing persons who are incarcerated the right to vote.

ENTITIES ARE NOT INDIVIDUALS

Government must be of, for, and by the people, not corporations.

We also believe:

- That people cannot be owned, therefore corporations do not qualify as people because they have owners;
- For a truly representative and democratic system of governing all elections must be of, for, and by the people of this nation, conducted without the undue sway of money, influence, or power;

Therefore we will:

- a) Support a US Constitutional amendment that would firmly establish that corporations are not persons and are not entitled to first amendments protections and that the spending of money to influence elections is not protected free speech;
- b) Support legislation and regulations that require the full disclosure of all sources of funding for all political advertising and activities;

INCLUSIVE PRIMARY ELECTIONS

Colorado should establish an open and inclusive primary election that epitomizes the Democratic Party principle of inclusiveness.

We also believe:

- That all registered voters regardless of their party affiliation should be allowed to participate and to vote in a primary election for any candidate regardless of that candidate's party affiliation.
- The primary should take place in a manner similar to other Colorado elections (i.e. mail ballot with voter assistance centers, etc);

Therefore we will:

- a) Work to educate the populace and our elected officials about the necessity of open primaries as a means to foster our democratic form of government;
- b) Continue to have all Broomfield Democratic Party meetings remain open to the general populace.

ONE PERSON ONE VOTE

The Democratic Party should honor the principle of one-person one vote by eliminating the practice of special privilege that takes the form of super delegates.

We also believe:

- National legislation or constitutional amendments guarantee that every citizen of the US who is of legal voting age shall have the fundamental right to vote with ease, without restriction and with no threat of disenfranchisement in any public election held in the jurisdiction in which the citizen resides, and that all such votes shall be counted;
- Each individual vote is of equal value and shall count as only one vote regardless of that individual's wealth, position, current or former offices held, etc;
- That Colorado should join the Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by popular vote.

Therefore we will:

- a) Support legislation and regulations that prohibit the gerrymandering of Congressional Districts to favor any political party;
- b) Support changes to party rules to eliminate super delegates and for popular vote alone to be the deciding factor in allocating delegates;
- c) Support a Constitutional amendment to eliminate the Electoral College process in favor of elections by popular vote.

FINANCING ELECTIONS

Money should not deter a candidate from running for office.

We also believe:

- There needs to be an end to the legalized corruption that has come to define modern politics;
- Political spending needs to be public and transparent so Americans can know who is buying influence in our political elections and legislative processes;
- There needs to be a change in how elections are funded.

Therefore we will:

- a) Call for full disclosure of all sources of funding for all political advertising and activities;
- b) Call for the passage of tough anti-corruption laws in cities and states across the US;
- c) Call for mandatory public funding for all campaigns that demonstrate a baseline of support;

E. PROTECTING THE ENVIRONMENT

Including the following:

Energy Independence
Environment

ENERGY INDEPENDENCE

Energy independence helps the nation attain peace and prosperity. We must increase the use of alternative energy sources, reduce the use of fossil fuels and research and improve the safety of fossil fuel extraction.

We also believe:

- The impact on climate change is due to the gross over consumption of fossil fuel per capita;
- We need to commit to reducing emissions and other environmental contamination from human activities in order to mitigate the effects of climate change;
- We must make a commitment to reduce emissions and other environmental contamination from human activities in order to mitigate the effects of climate change;
- Our country must transition to clean, sustainable production of energy, goods and services as well as becoming more efficient in conservation;
- In the necessity of developing coherent energy policies at local, state, and national levels to limit environmental degradation and climate change;
- Human activities like resource extraction and agriculture must include full remediation of environmental damage, enforced through the use of effective, independent monitoring and verification.

Therefore we will:

- a) Actively work to eliminate the use of fossil fuels and move to sustainable energy source like wind, hydroelectric, solar, and geothermal, as well as modern nuclear power sources that are a safe and efficient way to meet base energy needs;
- b) Support legislation and policies to protect our public and private lands, ecosystems, and the integrity of our food supply;
- c) Call on our elected officials to fund urgent and continual upgrading of the US power grid so it is capable of handling a variety of energy sources for enhanced efficiency, security, reliability, and flexibility;
- d) Call on elected officials throughout the US to decommission unsafe pressurized water design nuclear reactors as soon as possible;
- e) Call on elected officials to eliminate all subsidies for fossil fuels and ethanol;
- f) Call on our electric utilities to produce 50% of their electricity from renewable sources by 2025;
- g) Support efforts to replace Colorado's investor-owned utilities with state-regulated, competitive energy markets of independent suppliers, coordinated through

- non-competing, regulated system operators that provide transmission, distribution and balancing services only;
- h) Work to ensure that citizens are permitted to participate in decision-making processes at the Colorado Public Utilities Commission;
 - i) Support legislation and regulations that require Colorado utilities to publish accurate curtailment data at least once a year;
 - j) Support the requirement that renewable energy produced by consumers can be sold back to the local utility at the same price as energy that is purchased from the local utility;
 - k) Support the retraining of workers who lose their jobs as a result of the transition to greater energy efficiency and renewable energy technologies such as solar panels, wind turbines, biogas digesters, etc on their property.

ENVIRONMENT

We must ensure that the environment is sustainable and protected for future generations.

We also believe:

- That the health of the earth is a top priority;
- That the environment impacts every aspect of our lives;
- That the current system needs to be rapidly overhauled in order to ensure a healthy environment into the future;
- That our current system is not sustainable;
- That climate change is a threat to national security;
- That factory farming is a major contributor to greenhouse gas emissions, inhumane treatment of animals, and accelerating the evolution of antibiotic resistant bacteria.

Therefore we will:

- a) Support legislation to reduce greenhouse gas emissions;
- b) Encourage biodegradable alternatives to traditional oil based plastics;
- c) Support eliminating exemptions to the Clean Air Act, Clean Water Act, and Safe Drinking water Act;
- d) Support the mass expansion of public transportation and encourage the move towards electric vehicles;
- e) Support legislation to minimize factory farming of meat and crops;
